### Another comparison

I am one of those who has been campaigning to save the ancient rock art on the Burrup peninsula. I fear that much of it will be lost or moved. Moving the rocks will destroy their essential context. The minister "assures" me that 60 per cent of the art will be saved. He means that 40 per cent will be destroyed.
