

## See the top end on a road safari

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All Terrain Safaris have the North-West and Top End covered, offering outback adventures in some of the State's most remote locations.

Small parties of no more than 16 in custom-made four-wheel-drive buses leave from Perth, Broome, Kununurra and Darwin, making the trips accessible for travellers.

Managing director Dragan Malesic said the 12-day Gibb River/Plateau and Bungles Adventure which, begins and ends in Broome, offered travellers a true taste of the outback.

"Most of our clients want a full view of the Kimberley rather than a glimpse of it," Mr Malesic said. "The Broome-to-Broome tour covers the whole region.

"We spend two nights at the Bungle Bungles, which gives people a chance to relax, do the walks and enjoy the scenery.

We also visit all the gorges on the Gibb River Road, and camp on the Mitchell Plateau, which is something that many companies don't do.

"When everyone else disappears, we have the evenings to ourselves up there."

The Broome-to-Broome tour also visits the Pentecost Ranges, El Questro, Kununurra, Lake Argyle and Halls Creek and costs \$1998 per person.

It departs Wednesdays from April 30 to October 15.
